Jeff Sullivan is one of 116 new Queen's Counsel appointed in the 2020 competition and is one of only six solicitors appointed. The title of Queen's Counsel is awarded to those who have demonstrated particular skill and expertise in the conduct of advocacy. Queen's Counsel are appointed by The Queen, on the advice of the Lord Chancellor, following consideration by the independent Queen's Counsel Selection Panel. The new Queen's Counsel were announced on December 17, 2020.

Jeff Sullivan is a U.S. and English qualified partner in the London office of Gibson, Dunn & Crutcher, where he is a member of the firm's International Arbitration Group.
