Kareem Ramadan represents companies, universities, and other organizations in high-profile congressional investigations. Kareem has represented clients before more than a dozen congressional committees in both chambers, including the House Committees on Oversight and Government Reform, Energy and Commerce, Education and Workforce, Judiciary, Financial Services, and Homeland Security; the House Select Committees on the Strategic Competition Between the United States and the Chinese Communist Party and on the January 6th Attack on the United States Capitol; and the Senate Committees on the Judiciary, Finance, Commerce, Homeland Security and Governmental Affairs, Budget, and Health, Education, Labor, and Pensions. His work spans every stage of a congressional investigation: developing response strategy to letter requests and subpoenas, managing document productions and privilege issues, preparing chief executives and other senior witnesses for transcribed interviews and public hearings, and drafting responses to questions for the record. He also counsels clients on federal ethics and lobbying rules.

Kareem's recent congressional investigations experience includes representing:

- A national public media organization in oversight of federal funding for public broadcasting by the House Oversight Committee's Delivering on Government Efficiency (DOGE) Subcommittee and the House Energy and Commerce Committee, including preparation of the organization's chief executive to testify at a public hearing
