

Webcast: Tariff Evasion

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With the launch of the new U.S. Department of Justice/Department of Homeland Security cross-agency Trade Fraud Task Force, importers and their affiliates are at heightened risk of criminal and civil enforcement actions for alleged violations of tariffs, duties, and import restrictions.
