successful outcomes. Our SCOTUS victory for Slack in the direct listings case was significant. By convincing the SCOTUS to reject plaintiff's attempt to abandon the tracing requirement of Section 11 of the Securities Act, we were able to fend off what was poised to be a significant threat to the capital-formation process. We also obtained a major victory in the Ninth Circuit on behalf of United Behavioral Health in an ERISA health benefits class action. In winning the appeal, the firm dramatically reversed the momentum in eight years of litigation in which UBH (represented by a different firm) had lost class certification, summary judgment, trial/liability, a remedies phase, a \$20 million fees and costs award for plaintiffs, and numerous other rulings.
