ose Ring, a partner and co-chair of Gibson, Dunn & Crutcher's technology litigation practice group, is being recognized as one of 30 Women Leaders in Tech Law as part of The Recorder's California Legal Awards.

Ring recently shared with The Recorder her accomplishments over the last year and advice for women starting out in tech.

What's your proudest professional achievement of the past year and why?

Serving as lead counsel for Meta in a matter, which, after nearly five years, resulted in a favorable

resolution that the U.S. Department of Justice described as "historic" as the first case to address the potential for bias in the use of algorithms and Al by the tech industry.

What's one piece of advice you'd give to a woman starting out in tech law?

Don't be afraid of taking on cases involving even the most complicated technologies. If you have a logical mind, which you do if you are a lawyer, you can figure it out!

What is a group or tool that has helped you grow in your career or contributes to the development

of pipelines for women leaders in tech law? Timekeeper reports for my matters, which I use to make sure I am identifying and building talent on my teams and that women (and men) actually get a range of experiences that help them do their best work and grow their own careers.

What aspects of your work do you find meaningful?

Learning about industries and technologies that are not just at the forefront of the development of tech law, but involve a larger debate around whether and how these industries and technologies are impacting society.
