When you first started in your career, what strategies did you employ to amplify your voice and ensure that the issues important to you were heard by decision makers?

I've always believed that real influence—the kind that sways decisions, exerts impact, and changes lives-must be earned. And it's earned thought consistent and unwavering effort. Early in my career, I decided that no one was ever going to out-work me. And I was blessed with great bosses who valued difference-making contributions whether they came from the most junior members of the team or the most senior. One of the most important things to learn—and one of the hardest—is to get comfortable with being uncomfortable, to consistently challenge yourself not to let fear keep you from speaking when you have something to say or acting when you have

something to contribute. That's a skill that you develop over time, with a lot of reps. So go easy on yourself and just keep at it.
